



Missing Maps

Problem:

- Worldwide disasters kill almost 100,000 people and can displace more than 200 million
- Severely impacted places are often missing from maps
- What is Missing Maps?
 - Project that encourages volunteers to map missing areas





Missing Maps MAPathons

- How to get involved?
 - It's simple! You only need a laptop and Internet connection - get started by visiting this website
- Humanitarian OpenStreetMap tasking manager
 - HOTOSM
 - Wide variety of regions that need mapping data





MAPathons - Missing Maps

- Event where volunteers can gather to map certain regions
- One of the easiest events to hold online
- Helpful to have a 1-2 hour session to teach attendees how to map; second half with volunteers mapping on their own
- Most regions require specific Missing Maps training before hosting a MAPathon
- Have fun with it!






- Through the Lens of Diversity

 - "If you were born in the United States, turn on your camera"
 - "If you have experienced racial discrimination, turn on your camera"

 - "Fewer than 4 million babies are born in the United States each year"
 - "26% of LGBTQ+ youth say their biggest problems are not feeling accepted, bullying, & a fear to be out"

Mingle for a Mission



VIRTUAL MINGLE FOR A MISSION

About

Building friendships is a large part of the Red Cross, and online connections are no exception. We adapted the <u>original Mingle for a Mission guide</u> to a virtual format so that you can continue networking within your region while raising money for the Red Cross. Get your snacks ready for this fun social event!

Detailed Timeline

Step 1: Logistics Planning [1 Month Prior]
\square Reach out to your local Red Cross unit and find a contact that can guide you to resources to help
make your event impactful and successful.

□ Decide on a video calling platform (e.g. Microsoft Teams, Zoom, or Google Meet) or virtual streaming platform (e.g. Netflix, Kast, or Vemos) for your event. Some of these platforms require an account, so make sure your participants are aware of these restrictions.

Step 2: Event Development [3 Weeks Prior]

 $\hfill \square$ Develop activity ideas – here are some to get you started:



Mingle for a Mission

- Host a movie night using a virtual streaming service. Feel free to make it themed (e.g. IHL Movie Night). After watching, have a discussion about the movie and encourage youth to socialize.
- Organize a talent show! You can have different acts sign up for slots throughout the show. Here
 is a Battle of the Bands event that can be turned into a virtual talent show.
- Include an online fundraiser component to your event (e.g. selling admission tickets or
 donations for disaster relief). Plan how you will collect fundraising money through platforms like
 Venmo, Apple Pay, or Zelle; please review this <u>case study</u> regarding fundraising for the Red
 Cross using Venmo. You can also work with your region and local Fund Development team to
 set up fundraisers.
- Set up a streaming fundraiser during the event using <u>Tiltify</u> or <u>GoFundMe</u>. Feel free to work with your region and local Fund Development team to organize this fundraiser.

Step 3: Promotion & Organization [2 Weeks Prior]

☐ Team up with other Red Cross Clubs or organizations in your community to increase involvement.
\square Post event details on your local Red Cross region calendar and social media.
Step 4: Hosting the Event [Day of] ☐ Engage with your audience and initiate icebreaker social activities.
□ Have fun!

TWEETS TO THANK

About

Social media is unique because it allows you to connect with people virtually. We have updated the <u>original Activity Guide</u> for this digital competition so that you can thank and encourage blood donors. This event asks American Red Cross digital advocates, volunteers who spread awareness and take action virtually, to work in teams to acknowledge blood donors for their life-saving gift.

Detailed Timeline

Step 1: Logistics Planning [3 Weeks Prior]
☐ Decide on a unique hashtag for your team (ex. #SouthernCaliforniaRedCross). The purpose of this hashtag is to show that your tweets are being made on behalf of your Club and to track how many donors your team has thanked.
\Box Determine how long your competition will last (we suggest 3-5 days). In addition, create a tracking board to monitor and update your progress and motivate your team during the competition.
Step 2: Promotion & Organization [2 Weeks Prior] ☐ Team up with other Red Cross Clubs or organizations in your community to increase involvement.
☐ Post competition instructions and details on your local Red Cross region calendar and social media.



Tweets to Thank

Step 3: Hosting the Competition [2 Weeks Prior]

- □ Before starting the event, explain to your volunteers how to find blood donors on Twitter. You can search for specific hashtags (ex. #RedCross, #giveblood, #blooddonor, #blooddonation) or ask your local Red Cross regional Communications team for current hashtags.
- ☐ After locating a donor, volunteers should tweet a thank you message (see examples below)
 - Dear Matt, thank you for donating blood today! It is because of generous blood donors like you
 that the Red Cross can help save lives.
 - Dear Amy, today you helped save a life! On behalf of the (insert Club name), thank you for your generous blood donation.
 - Dear Sarah, on behalf of the (insert Club name), thank you for giving blood!

Step 4: Recognition and Continuation

- ☐ Host a virtual recognition ceremony using Microsoft Teams, Zoom, or other meeting platforms to celebrate your team's work and recognize the participants who posted the most thank you tweets with a small prize.
- ☐ Make this a recurring activity! Your Club can organize it at the beginning of every month and incorporate progress checks and recognition throughout your Club meetings.

Whether you are new to Tiltify or already have an account, you can set up a fundraiser in 10 easy steps:

Step 1: Create an account

☐ Create or sign into your Tiltify account.

Step 2: Create a campaign

☐ Go to "Create a New Campaign".

Step 3: Search for American Red Cross

☐ Search for the American Red Cross as the charity you want to support.

Step 4: Create an event

☐ Either select an event already happening or choose just to support the ARC

Step 5: Register for a campaign

☐ Register as an individual campaign or register to support a team.

Step 6: Publish your fundraiser

☐ Publish your fundraiser!

Live Stream Gaming Resources: Overlay Overview

When it comes to fundraising, having a visual element or overlay that displays how much money is raised can help make your charity stream more successful. An overlay is a graphic, gif, video or web source that is applied to your main video stream as a layer via using free live streaming software. Overlays can communicate interesting information about your stream and help you engage with your viewers visually. On Tiltify, fundraisers can choose from 3 different overlays that link directly to your campaign and can help take your fundraising game to the next level.

Finding and Adding Your Campaign Overlays on Tiltify

- On the left-hand side of your Campaign Dashboard, click the Overlay tab
- From here you will see three different overlay options:
 - a. **Compact Overlay** This overlay is typically placed in the top-center and stretches across 60% of the screen. This overlay contains the cause avatar and name, your progress bar, goal, amount raised, and highlights the last donor, next milestone, and the top donor. A great overlay solution if you want a lot of information in a minimal amount of space.
