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

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




Most Common Genetic Disease in U.S.

Sickle cell disease affects about 100,000 people—largely Black and African Americans.







Optimal Matches = Best Transfusions

- Transfusion is a key treatment.
- With frequent transfusions, closely matched blood can decrease risk of adverse reactions.
- Blood given to patients with rare blood types must be matched very closely to reduce the risk of developing complications from transfusion therapy.
- Are you the match for a Sickle Cell Patient in need or Do you know someone who might be?

Your donation will be used to help sickle cell patients.




With Lifesaving Blood, Tymia Thrives

By just age 10, Tymia McCullough had been hospitalized a remarkable 40 times.

She has sickle cell disease, and there is just one treatment.

Tymia receives blood transfusions every few months. They let her live a normal life, which she never takes for granted.

SCF High School Scholarship Program | Review

Purpose	Rewards schools that successfully collect blood from donors who are Black though a student scholarship program
	 Goal of helping sickle cell patients by diversifying the blood supply, while also promoting access to, and diversity in higher education
	Scholarship recipient is encouraged to host drives in college
Eligibility	 Program timeframe: July 1 through June 30 (FY22 retroactive to 7/1/21) \$5,000 scholarship to the top ten high schools in the country that collect the most units from donors who self-identify as African American ✓ Minimum of 50 productive units from self-identified African American donors ✓ Host at least one blood drive during program timeframe May be combined with other programs or incentives High schools are eligible whether the drive is hosted at the school or an off-site location



SCF High School Scholarship Program | Overview Con't



	High school administration selects scholarship recipient based on Red Cross recommended criteria
Recommended	✓ Student must be in his/her senior year of high school at an accredited state educational facility
Criteria for	✓ Student must utilize the scholarship to continue his/her education at an accredited two-year, four-year or professional trade school
Scholarship Recipient	✓ Student is actively engaged in supporting the Red Cross sickle cell initiative by helping inspire members of the Black community to give blood
	 The scholarship will be awarded in the recipient's name on behalf of the Red Cross to the recipient's institution of higher education or to their 529 college savings account
F. Hillmoord	Top 10 schools will be notified at the end of the fiscal year
Fulfillment	School administration to provide the scholarship winner information
Sponsor	Help students achieve higher education goals, while supporting the community by promoting access to, and diversity in higher education
Benefits	Provide leadership and scholarship opportunities to students
